The Social Fund

Background

At its inception in 1992, KVTC established a Social Fund to support village communities, who used to have access to KVTC land before acquisition by the company.

The Social Fund was set up to improve social infrastructure in the surrounding communities and focuses mainly on education, health and economic infrastructures improvements. The fund does not support political or religion activities.

From 1992-2000 the Social Fund was channeled through an NGO and the District Council however from the year 2000 the Fund was allocated directly to the villages.

Coverage

Since the start the Social Fund has expanded from 9 to 17 villages as a result of inclusion of adjacent villages as well as the sub-dividing of villages following population. In 2009 Mavimba was added following the construction of the sawmill and shift of the company's Head Quarters.

Project Selection

The Village Council identifies a community project and presents this project to the KVTC Management who conducts an initial

screening. If the proposed project meets the Social Fund criteria, then the Village Council presents the project at the Village General Assembly for voting and petitioning. On successful submission the company approves funds to be released and monitors implementation. The District Council as well as the District Commissioner are informed of any Social Fund project that is approved as well as its completion.

Projects Supported and Impact

Since the year 2000 when support was channeled directly through village accounts there has been 700m TZS of funds released to support a total of 140 projects, with the majority related to education and schooling.

Often Social Fund money is used as cofunding of a project and as such the total impact and value of projects is significantly higher than the reported figure above.

The KVTC Biomass Challenge

On the 14th of December KVTC launched the Biomass Challenge together with the Private Forestry Programme.

Launch Party

On 14th of December 2017 KVTC hosted approximately 60 of its closest relations at a private cocktail event held at the Coral Beach Hotel in Dar es Salaam.

The event was graced by Hon. January Makamba, Minister of Union Affairs and Environment who together with a representative of the Embassy of Finland launched the Biomass Challenge.

Background

Majority of households in Tanzania depend on firewood and charcoal for their energy needs and with a growing population this is resulting in ever increasing pressure on Tanzania's forests

KVTC operates a forest plantation and sawmill in the Ulanga District (Morogoro) and supplies roundlogs to an additional four sawmills in the area. All sawmills are generating significant amounts of unutilized by-products from their milling operations

KVTC believes that finding solutions to sawmill residues can offer some solution to Tanzania's energy needs and assist in reducing deforestation whilst at the same time offer economic opportunities for the company to monetize its waste products.

The Award

The winning business plan, to be determined through an open and robust vetting and judging process by a panel consisting of KVTC and PFP executives will receive an <u>award of TZS 75,000,000</u>
