KVTC Donates Passengers Shelter to Ifakara Airstrip

Ifakara air strip is among 58 airports which are owned by the Government of Tanzania (GoT) and managed by Tanzania Airport Authority (TAA). The airstrip was established in 1956 before independence.

The road distance from Dar Es Salaam to Ifakara is about 320 kms. It takes ten-hours to drive from Dar Es Salaam to Ifakara while by airplane it is a one-hour flight.

The runway is 1480 meters long, 40 meters wide with a gravel surface. The airstrip can accommodate 14 Caravans and 3 ATR42s at once.

Tanzania National Parks (TANAPA), Tanzania Wildlife Authority (TAWA), Auric Air, Pelican Air, Frankfurt Zoological Society, Jambo Aviation are main airline users of Ifakara Airstrip. Most passengers are connected to Kilombero Valley Teak Company (KVTC), Ifakara Health Institute (IHI), St Francis Hospital, GoT, TANAPA - for Tourism and TAWA.

The airfield did not have facilities for sheltering passengers and their belongings. KVTC stepped in mainly through the efforts of its Board of Directors' Ambassador Ami Mpungwe to build a shelter that includes a resting area, toilet facilities and water bore hole. The facility also accommodates firefighting equipment.

Uhuru Torch Relay



The 2021 Uhuru Torch lighting and relay was graced on 17th May 2021 by President Hussein A. Mwinyi in South Unguja Region of Zanzibar, the birthplace of President Samia S. Hassan. The theme for the relay was "*Tehama ni Msingi wa Taifa Endelevu; Itumike kwa Usahihi* (Information and Communications Technology is the Basis of a Sustainable Nation; It should be Used Appropriately)".

Ulanga District was one of the 150 administrative districts that the Torch covered. On the 5th of August 2021 the Torch arrived in Ulanga District from Kilombero District The District Commissioner for Ulanga, Hon. Ngollo N. Malenya led the Torch delegation headed by Col. Josephine P. Mwambashi to the Nursery. A brief speech about the activities undertaken at the nursery was read by the Nursery Manager, Jeremiah Gumadi.

After the speech the delegation took a tour of the Nursery to appreciate the production of clones, seedlings, and stumps. The head of the delegation issued teak seedlings to 4 schools and 5 villagers to symbolise environmental conservation before she planted a memorial teak tree.

The event closed with a congratulatory message from the head of the delegation on the work KVTC was doing. KVTC management presented a teak wood carving engraved with the Uhuru Torch to the head of the delegation and 6 teak wood cell phone holders.
